Water management plans

In river basin areas are the most important planning documents in water management. The National Water Management Authority is developing a project of the II update to these documents (IaPGW) for 9 river basin areas: Wisła, Odra, Dniestr, Dunaj, Bańówka, Łaba, Niemen, Pregola, and Świeża.

Sustainable water management

guarantees the availability of good quality waters and improvement of their condition. The National Water Management Authority has developed a project for the second update of Water management plans in the areas of river basins.
